# EAST COAST TASMANIA

One of Australia's finest coastal drives, this 176-kilometre route stretches along Tasmania's east coast and encompasses pristine coastline, boutique wineries, seafood shacks and a string of holiday towns. Natural highlights include Maria Island, Freycinet National Park and the perfect arc of Wineglass Bay.

## How to get there

BY AIR Fly to Hobart or Launceston BY CAR

Explore the <u>Great Eastern Drive</u> starting from Orford in the south (one hour from Hobart), or from St Helens in the north (two hours from Launceston). This road trip can be tailored to fit a weekend, a week, or longer.

## Top things to do

#### SEA-BASED ACTIVITIES

- Explore the coast on a <u>Freycinet Adventures</u> guided sea kayak tour, the ultimate way to experience Freycinet National Park.
- Spend a half day cruising the waterways surrounding Freycinet National Park from Coles Bay to Wineglass Bay with Pennicott Wilderness Journeys <u>Wineglass</u> <u>Bay Cruises.</u>

#### LAND-BASED ACTIVITIES

- Visit <u>east coast wineries</u> and drop into the <u>Freycinet</u>
   <u>Marine Farm</u> or <u>Melshell Oyster Shack</u> for a seafood fix.
- Catch the ferry to <u>Maria Island</u> to see World Heritage convict sites, fascinating wildlife and the colourful painted cliffs.
- In Bicheno, experience the power of the ocean at the <u>blowhole</u>, enjoy freshly-caught fish and chips, and in the evening see the little penguins come ashore with <u>Bicheno Penguin Tours.</u>
- Cycle the scenic <u>St Helens mountain bike trails</u> with a ride to suit all levels of experience.
- Take the short walk to Douglas Apsley Waterhole in <u>Douglas Apsley National Park</u> near Bicheno, then walk through tall tree ferns near Pyengana to <u>St Columba</u> <u>Falls</u>, one of Tasmania's highest waterfalls.

- Pause at Pyengana's <u>The Pub in the Paddock</u>, one of the oldest pubs in Australia, and meet Priscilla the beer drinking pig.
- Drop into the <u>Spring Bay Distillery</u> to sample locally produced gin and whisky.
- Deepen your understanding of Tasmanian palawa culture on the <u>wukalina walk</u>, a four-day Aboriginal owned and operated guided walk in larapuna/Bay of Fires.

## **Top attractions**

- In Freycinet National Park, climb to <u>Wineglass</u>
   <u>Bay Lookout</u> to see the bay's turquoise water and perfect arc of white sand, then continue to <u>Cape</u>
   <u>Tourville lighthouse</u> for dramatic coastal views.
- Join a four-day guided adventure and explore the length of the Freycinet Peninsula on a <u>Freycinet</u> <u>Experience Walk</u>.
- Marvel at the rare combination of turquoise water, white sand and granite rocks splashed with orange lichen at <u>Bay of Fires</u>.
- Experience unusual wildlife, rich history, rugged coastline and fresh local produce on the four-day guided <u>Maria Island Walk.</u>
- Take time to stop along the <u>Great Eastern Drive</u> to soak up the coastal vistas, visit classic holiday towns and follow meandering beach tracks.



## Where to stay

- Freycinet Lodge offers secluded cabins in a wilderness setting within Freycinet National Park. New offerings include well-appointed Coastal Pavilions nestled at the edge of the park, overlooking Richardson's Beach.
- Bay of Fires Bush Retreat has relaxed, simpleyet-stylish accommodation in a peaceful bush setting. With a fully-equipped communal kitchen, guests can prepare their own meals or choose from a variety of catered options.
- Swansea Beach Chalets occupies a scenic beachfront location overlooking Freycinet
   Peninsula. The fully self-contained chalets, with private balconies, provide a central location from which to explore the east coast, catch a fish, or simply relax.
- In Orford, <u>The Eastcoaster</u> offers a mix of motel rooms, villas and cabins. Guests can enjoy an over-water restaurant and bar, sea-view dining decks, outdoor and indoor swimming pools, spa, gym, squash and tennis courts, fishing jetty, boat ramp and beach access.

 Choose from lodge accommodation or selfcontained options at <u>White Sands Estate</u>. Soak up the surrounds, try fly fishing or canoeing on the lake, and sample beer, wine and whisky at the on-site Ironhouse Brewery and Distillery.

# Weather

The average high temperature in January (summer) is 17-23°C and in July (winter) is between 3-11°C.
